Ready to fly X-Country

What do you need to have organised on a typical club day?



On the day

- DI glider
- Have food and drink prepared
- Have a good brunch before you go
- Jump in and have fun!
- Hang on a minute....

Annually

Glider trailer warranted/registered

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- Parachute repacked
- Need BFR/Medical?

Earlier in the week

- How to do big distance? Start early, finish late.
- Keep an eye on the weather. Is it going to be good to start early?
- See if tow pilot will be available earlier.
- Book Glider
- Find OO if doing a badge flight
- Ensure SPOT set up on correct site

Day before

- Plan Task
- Confirm tow pilot start time
- Set up GPS and logger
- Ensure batteries are charged.
 - Glider batteries, mobile, GPS, logger, SPOT
- Water bottle in fridge
- Download badge forms

On the day

- Food/Drink in glider
- GPS/Logger
- Check trailer, hook car on (if you want a quick retrieve!)
- Pee system/bags
- Task sheet
- Clean glider
- Check cushions, gotta be comfy

- Water ballast if your'e flying with it
- Car got petrol
- Landout jacket
- Landout crew
- etc...

Retrieves

Retrieve Tips Before you go

- Make sure you have phone number of who's coming to get you. And vice versa.
- Leave your ph details in car, along with any special instructions.
- Petrol for a long retrieve.
- Ensure trailer is tidy and ready to go.
- 2 keys for your car. One on hook, one in pocket.
- Know your trailer. Or get someone to retrieve you who does.

After you land

- Check for animals
- Call in coordinates. Ensure the format correct.
- Pull tape off, probes out, winglets off.
- Collect everything in a pile that needs to go in car. GPS in particular during a contest. Batteries out.
- Go for a walk! Take liquid & food with you.

Pee Systems

You have to pee

- Flights will get longer as you do more. 3+ hours
- Not drinking means dehydration
- Makes life far more pleasant

Pee tube in glider

- Easiest and cleanest method.
- Pee into a funnel
- Retractable tube works well, nothing on glider

Bags



- Ziplock bags
- Empty out window, or store. Don't throw bags out.
- One tip to rule them all... one inside the other



- Fit before you fly
- No mucking around

Contests

- Great time to do x-country
- Pushes you into new areas and conditions
- Need even more preparations

Loggers

- Ensure you have a reliable logger. Turn on and forget.
 - e.g. Garmin, FLARM
- IGC when needed
 - e.g. Nano
- Backup! Could be nav device.

Navigation

- For tasks, navigating to waypoints, airspace
- Devices: Oudie, Mobile phone, PNA, PDA
- Software: SeeYou Mobile, XCSoar, LK8000

Navigation

- Know how to load on waypoints and airspace
- Know how to remove track from device
- Know how to navigate a task
- Learn on the ground!
- Set tasks on club days, and practice

Start early

- More time to fix any issues
- Get club gliders out before rest of club
- Water pressure better earlier

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
